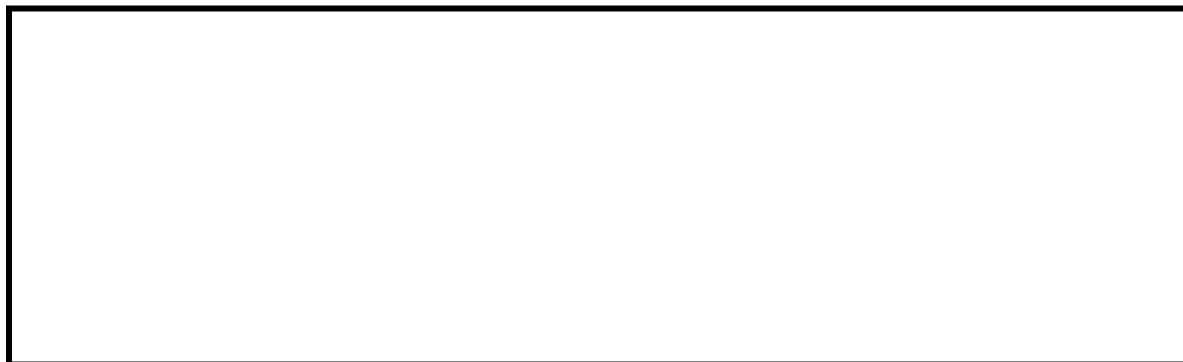

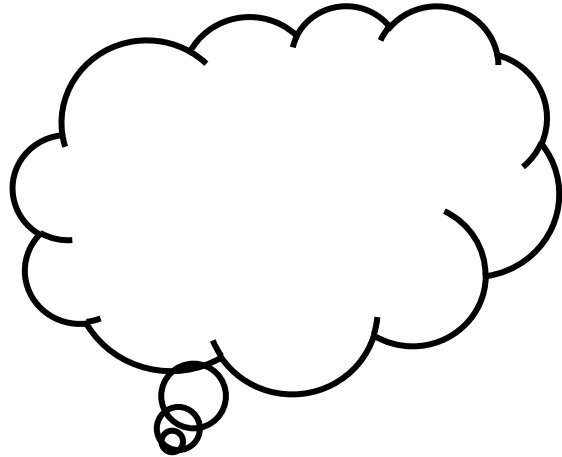
What significant events have happened on this night? The one most know about is the Israelites' exit from Egypt. Draw a picture to illustrate this event.

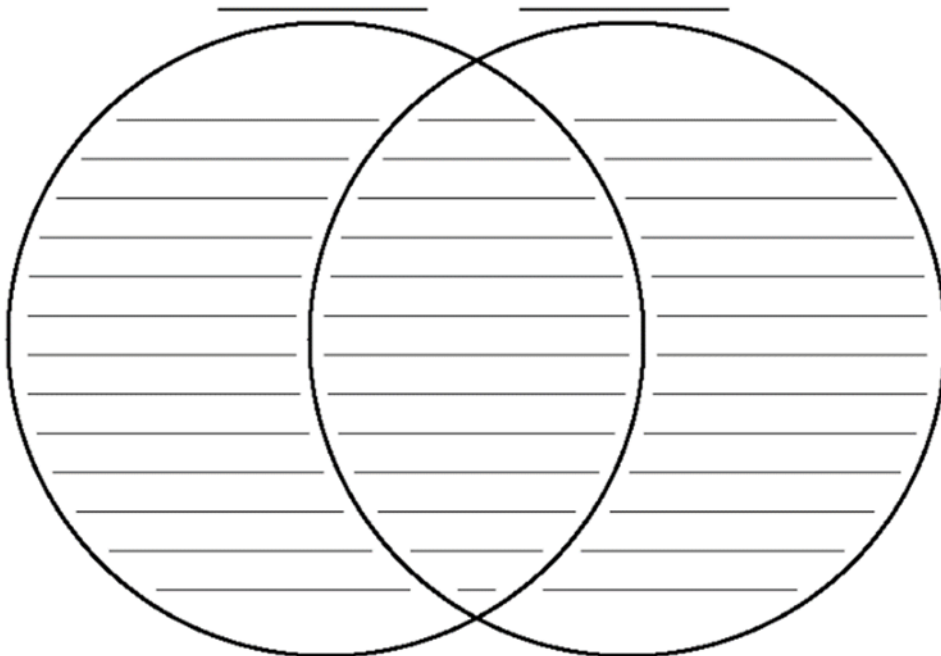
Read Ex. 13:3. Why do you think God wants this night remembered & observed through generations?
